Moving and handling	Staff may incur sprains and strains from lifting pupils	<ul> <li>Staff encourage pupils to be as independent as possible to minimise the need to lift.</li> <li>Staff must make sensible judgements and only lift a pupil where there is no other option.</li> </ul>
